THE ENGLISH MUSIC FESTIVAL

AT ST GEORGE'S IN FEBRUARY 2020

THE ENGLISH MUSIC FESTIVAL (EMF) celebrates Britain's rich musical heritage by showcasing the brilliance, innovation and beauty of works by British composers, with a particular emphasis on unearthing works that have been overlooked or forgotten. Although the focus of the Festival is the Golden Renaissance of English Music - the late-nineteenth to mid-twentieth centuries, the programmes span mediaeval music through to contemporary music; indeed, the Festival has commissioned numerous thrilling and accessible new works from some of Britain's most admired contemporary composers. The EMF is proud to have staged the world première performances of not just these new pieces, but also of important works by composers such as Frederick Delius, Ralph Vaughan Williams, Sir Edward Elgar, Sir Charles Villiers Stanford, and Sir Hubert Parry (among many others).

Thus far, twelve main Festivals have been held in Oxfordshire, as well as four Autumn Festivals in the Cotswolds – in the south-west of England – and in Yorkshire (in the north-east). The Festivals are complemented by a UK & European Concert Series, which hosts regular events in London as well as in other locations ranging from Birmingham and Dorset to France and Sweden.

EM Records, and the publishing arm, EM Publishing, take the Festival to a new level, further facilitating accessibility of these rare and wonderful pieces by enabling listeners worldwide to experience these works for themselves, giving performers previously-denied access to scores, and advancing scholarship and knowledge of composers and musicians through their books.

The driving force behind the Festival, EM Records and EM Publishing - Rupert and Em Marshall -Luck - recently undertook a most enjoyable and fulfilling recital tour in Johannesburg and Pretoria, and became aware of the many excellent venues and performers in South Africa, and of the interest in music evidenced by the enthusiastic and numerous audience members present at the concerts. They feel that an EMF in Johannesburg would be rewarding and culturally enriching for both the Festival and for music-lovers in the area.

A series of six concerts, will take place over the weekend of 14-16 February 2020 and, if successful, continue annually or biennially thereafter. The "home" of the Festival would be the beautiful and historical **St George's Church in Parktown**, with other events held in other local venues. The Festival would bring over one or two artists, who would work with South African musicians. Local choirs and musicians in solo capacities will be used as well.
